2023-2024 State of the Association March 24, 2024




- 14U, 12U, and 10U teams each had winning seasons and won their respective BTHL division end-ofseason tournaments

- Strengthened relationship with the OU Hockey coaching staff, including Coach Jamie McVicar leading skills training






#### 2023-2024 SEASON REGISTRATION RECOVERY

#### 2023-2024 SEASON BUSINESS CHALLENGES

- While the Association's efforts on the ice have had positive results, there have been deficiencies w/the back-of-house business
- Record keeping has been boxes that get passed around from year to year
- Many detailed records from 2017-2022 are incomplete or missing (financial receipts, meeting minutes, grant applications, etc.)
- AYHA's business license was allowed to expire for and 11-month period






#### 2023-2024 SEASON CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

- Past several seasons of income and expense data has been reconciled into consistent Quicken categories
- Reports are now being generated in Quicken to provide fiscal updates, future budget planning, and tracking by season
- Regular recording keeping from Board meetings and other AYHA business activities during the season

Association now has an accurate accounting of what specific activities are generating income and expenses over multiple seasons

Board can make better decisions on the activities that maximize income, reduce expenses, and right-size registration fees

Ensure that the Association is meeting its federal & state record keeping requirements, especially if the AYHA were to be audited






#### 2023-2024 SEASON INCOME & EXPENSE SUMMARY

- Income sources are registration fees, grants, donations, fundraising, and AYHA tournaments



#### 2023-2024 SEASON NOTEWORTHY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Earlier start to player registration and extended payment plans
- Bylaws reorganized & updated, eliminating conflicts w/the old Handbook
- Strengthened relationship between AYHA and OU Hockey coaching staff (skills coaching)
- Continued home-grown referee development
- CBJ Foundation covered the cost of the ice rental for LTPH
- Two well-run AYHA tournaments and a high school jamboree

  - Replacement chiller (gently used)
  - Roof repairs
  - Roof insulation
  - Interior painting
- Construction scheduled to be complete for the start of the 2024-2025 season
