

Who Does Athens Hockey Require to Be SafeSport Trained?

Current USA Hockey number to the Registrar, SafeSport training and successful background screening required for:

- a. All members of the Code of Conduct Committee (President, Vice-President & SafeSport Coordinator, Secretary, Treasurer, Past President)
- b. Registrar, Referee Scheduler, Drop-In supervisors
- c. Head coaches, assistant coaches, lead practice coaches, goalie coaches, Director of Hockey (individuals who regularly instruct players on ice or off)
- d. Locker Room Monitors (designated individuals who monitor locker rooms, minimum two per team).

Upon submission of a receipt to the Treasurer, AYHA reimburses these people for their background screening and reimburses those with on-ice duties for USA Hockey membership. Those with off-ice duties only can register with USA Hockey as volunteers at no cost.

Current USA Hockey number to the Registrar and SafeSport training required for

- a. All team representatives to the Board.
- b. Any other voting member of the Board not specifically required to also have a successful background screen.

Those with off-ice duties only can register with USA Hockey as volunteers at no cost.

Adults who are involved intermittently with player instruction, training, assessment, or supervision (e.g., intermittent skills instructors, intermittent volunteer on-ice or off-ice help, intermittent volunteer off-ice game officials, rink staff) are not required to be screened and SafeSport trained, but are required to abide by the One-on-One policy (SafeSport) and Athens Hockey's Locker Room Policy. Their interactions with unrelated minor players during Athens Hockey events must be observable and interruptible by other adults. They should not enter youth locker rooms except as a parent / guardian of a player in the locker room. An AYHA member who arranges for an outsider to provide player instruction, training, assessment, or supervision is also responsible for familiarizing that person with AYHA policies.
